### **Wingin' for Safety @ the Nite of Fire – by *Chris Hooper***

When you plan an event such as the Chapter VA-D *Wingin' for Safety @ the Nite of Fire* you can control most anything that occurs. You can organize volunteers, arrange for bands and color guards, have T-shirts designed and printed and even set-up to have the whole thing videotaped as a PR tool. BUT, the one thing you absolutely can't control is the weather. And, around Virginia lately, you can't even guess what the weather will be like 15 minutes from now, much less two – three months. Well, we threw the dice, and they came up sevens. In other words, we really were lucky!!! The weather looked threatening, but it never actually rained until all of our activities were over with and we were pretty much packed up and ready to leave.

We got to the track a little after noon, and started setting up all of our many different areas of responsibility. The Flournoys (50/50), Steve Whitmer (Bike Show), and the Nelmes (Registration and Sales), all were running around getting things set-up and in place along with their volunteers. Marty Simon was busy coordinating between the Virginia MotorSports Park people and the many other activities that we had planned. With 35 volunteers, we had a superb crew of people to pull off this event, and all of them looked fantastic in the specially embroidered "Event Staff" shirts which were provided by our sponsor Ace Uniform. Chapter D's Linda Whitmer (the Stitch Witch) had stayed up late for days making sure that the shirts were done in time.

Well everything eventually got set up and we were ready to get under way. We had a pretty good turn out for the People's Choice Bike Show, which ran from 3 – 5 PM. At 4:30 PM, Marty Simon and I had an appointment with the track manager for a videotaped interview for the PR tape. That took about 45 minutes. Then, it was time for the Rider's Meeting and the line-up for the parade on the track and the opening ceremonies. At 6:30pm, the Ft. Lee Army Band and Color Guard marched onto the track as we paraded down the service road escorted by two State Troopers on bikes. We stopped in front of the grandstands and our own JoAnn Spain performed America, and then the Star-Spangled Banner, accompanied by the band. Then we got to ride down the drag strip, led by the State Troopers with their sirens going, to the tune of Armed Forces on Parade played by the band.

Then it was back to our booth area to wait for the grand finale at 9 PM. At 8:30 everyone was in place for our last set of activities, which was to again ride in front of the grandstands, while the track manager conducted an interview with me over the track PA system for the benefit of the audience. This interview was to be the main object of the *Wingin' for Safety* event, because our whole purpose was to reach the motoring public with an awareness message.

The interview questions had been prepared before hand and provided to the track manager so that everybody could be on the same page. We had an audience of 8500 people (that was down 27% from the normal track crowd due to the weather). The interview went very well, being recorded by video cameraman.

Many of our people said that the audience even seemed to be paying attention to what we were saying. This is really fantastic, because as I said, this was the whole purpose for the evening. We gave away the trophies for the Bike Show, and had the drawings for the 50/25-15-10 awards. We all got a big round of applause from the audience as we left. Then, as I said, as we were just finishing our takedown, the skies opened up and the bottom dropped out. But, we all managed to make it back home safely.

I want to personally thank all of our volunteers, both in Chapter D and from other Chapters and organizations, which helped us put on this event. As I said previously, we had some 35 people who turned out to help. We didn't have as many participants in our parade as we had hoped, but we did have about thirty bikes. Also, as I mentioned, the track crowd was down about 27% from similar events, but still totaled some 8500 people. I'm sure the iffy weather played a large part in the low turnout both for our participants and for the track crowd. All in all though, the day was a huge success. It is always a gamble when you put on an outdoor event of this magnitude, especially for the first time. The main thing is that we didn't lose any money. In fact, we will probably be able to provide \$300-400 for our charity from the proceeds. That is fantastic, but the reason for that is because our sponsors who underwrote most of our expenses. Special thanks goes to Ace Uniform, Fred Green Tire & Exhaust, Quality Lincoln/Mercury, Hull Street Outlet, Tom McGrath, Ed's Honda, and Document Destruction Services. A very special thank you goes to Brian Pierce, General Manager of Virginia MotorSports Park, for their participation and assistance in allowing us to use their venue for our activities. We couldn't have done it without them.

But, most of all, I want to commend and thank Marty Simon. He conceived the idea four months ago and doggedly stayed with it until he saw it through. He single-handedly went out and procured the track, got the sponsors, and basically ram-rodged the whole event. Certainly we had good people in charge of the various activities, and they all came through with flying colors, but I can truthfully say that this event would never have happened without Marty's leadership. From Chapter D, we all want to say a big THANK YOU to Marty Simon. He has been accused of "thinking big." Well it's one thing to "think big," it's entirely another to "do big." Marty "DID BIG."

We need to leave the shopping center no later than 6:10 PM in order to travel to the fair and get into place for the 7PM parade. **Driving Directions:** The fair is located at the intersection of Krause Road and Courthouse Road Extended. If you are on I-95 North, take Exit 62 (Rt. 288 North) take Exit for Rt. 10 East (signs for Government Center & Pocahontas State Park). Continue approximately 2-3 miles to the shopping center. If you are on Route 10 west, travel through Chester and continue on until you get to the shopping center on the right. On the morning of August 22, 2003 the Relay will depart Winchester, VA with a stop in Orange, VA before arriving in Richmond, VA on the 53rd leg of the Pony Express Relay Eastern Trail. The Relay stop in Richmond will be at the Darden Garden behind the State Capital at 12 Noon. There will be a medallion pass ceremony on the steps of the Old City Hall building. The riders and staff will grab a quick lunch supplied by River City Diner and then on to Bob's BMW in Jessup, MD. Riders will be departing the Darden Garden at 1:30 PM. The Relay will make a stop in New Jersey on Saturday and then on to the closing ceremonies at Hard Rock Cafe in NYC on Sunday, Aug. 24. ### **From Assistant District Educator (Jim “The Shark” Sharkey)**

I always try to follow my Boy Scout training and be prepared. However, recently I got zinged twice. I attempt to be prepared by making sure my motorcycle is well maintained and that all parts are replaced when they need to be, if not before. I also replace my riding gear as it becomes worn or defective.

This spring I bought matching  $\frac{3}{4}$  helmets from a discount house on the Internet. The helmets were a well-known brand and I personally already owned 3 helmets made by this particular manufacturer. With less than a weeks wear and absolutely no misuse what so ever, I noticed two cracks in the plastic vents plus a hairline crack near the visor. The end result of this exercise is that despite ordering new gear, the new gear had a defect. It has been a long and painful journey but I am getting a replacement helmet from the manufacturer.

The next zinger was having to replace a rear tire that had only 7,000 miles on it. I normally get 20,000 plus miles on this brand of tire. As I was washing my Wing I noticed a bubble in the sidewall of my fairly new rear tire. Dang it – going to miss some riding – hope I don't miss that 3-day trip I have planned for the 4th of July. Wouldn't you know it – not one Honda dealer in Northern Virginia had a rear tire for my bike in stock. At least the riding gods were with me on this one. We were able to get the tire in and mounted Thursday night and I was able to head out Friday morning on a very enjoyable 3-day tour. The bottom line here is the tire manufacturer is going to send me a free tire, but I did have to pay for my current replacement tire and installation.

So what's his point you are asking yourself? Well the point I am trying to make is despite good preventive maintenance and buying new equipment – problems can still pop up. Just because you have new tires doesn't mean you shouldn't be checking them regularly.

Our two wheeled steeds are like horses in that they require constant care and an occasional reward for a job well done. So change your oil, check your tires and riding gear and add an occasional piece of chrome to your pride and joy.
